Use this address to get a Google Map of the location or to program your GPS vehicle navigator. NOTE: Be sure your reservation is at <u>THIS</u> Holiday Inn, <u>NOT</u> the Holiday Inn Express, elsewhere in town!

- ? Make your room reservation by calling Holiday Inn at 307-638-4466; state that you are attending the "Geodetic Survey Squadron Reunion" to get the special rate of \$85 per night.
- ? If you encounter any problems with room registration at the discounted rate, refer the person taking your reservation to our point of contact, **Katie Edmiston**, Sales Manager, direct line: 307-757-9112.
- ? The cut-off for reserving a hotel room at Holiday Inn for our reunion at this special rate is 20 July, but do not waiting that long. After 20 July, any unreserved rooms will go back to the regular price and be available to reunion attendees only on a space-available basis.
- ? The prices for our main events:
 - Friday Evening Ice-Breaker Social \$2 per person this covers the bartender fee only;
 Holiday Inn will provide free snack items, but drinks are on you.
 - O Saturday Mid-Day Luncheon -- \$13 per person
 - Sunday Brunch -- \$11 per person

IMPORTANT: I have told the hotel to expect about 100 people and secured the cost with my personal credit card. So, if you plan to attend any or all of these

three functions, please pay <u>ME</u> in advance by check for the events you plan to attend, <u>NOT</u> the hotel! You cannot pay for these reunion events by adding them to your hotel bill; they must be paid <u>to me</u> in advance, and I will settle with the hotel in a lump sum at the end of the reunion. When you send me your check, please include a brief note indicating what your check covers; i.e., which of the three events you plan to attend and how many people are in your party.

Commemorative Coin News

The coins are in!

They arrived at my door on 7 May right on schedule, and they look even better than the artwork on our

webpage! Meanwhile, there was a recurring comedy of errors with regard to the plastic protective 'flips' that arrived with the coins. The first set of flips was too small for our 47 mm coin. Then, the replacements were sent to Gordon Barnes instead of me! (And those were also too small!) The correctly fitting flips finally arrived at my door a few days ago, but the snafu delayed by two weeks my mailing out the coins to those who mail-ordered them. However, as of 22 May, all of the coins previously ordered are on their way to those who requested mail-order delivery.

After my last newsletter, more coin orders poured in. So far, I have received orders for <u>81</u> of these specially minted GSS/GSG commemorative coins, so *they're going fast!* If you have been procrastinating about placing an order, take a good look at the design at our GSS website http://www.1381st-gss.freeservers.com/ at the full color image of the coin. If you like what you see, send me your order.

How to Order Your Commemorative Coin

Whether you want your coins shipped or will pick them up yourself at the reunion, here's how to order.

First, check out the design online, and then, if you decide to order one or more, just send me an e-mail with the following information:

ORDER DATE:
YOUR NAME:
HOW MANY COINS:
Then tell me how to deliver:
"I WILL PICK UP MY COIN(S) AT THE REUNION."
or
"SEND MY COIN(S) TO ME POSTAGE PAID."
(Include your shipping address.)

The cost of the coins is \$15 each by mail order, postage paid, and only \$10 each if picked up at the GSS/GSG reunion in August. All coins will include the new protective plastic envelope. (*This one fits!*)

Either way, send no money now! I want you to receive your order and be completely happy with your coin(s), then either send me your payment (checks only, please) or return the coin(s). Reunion attendees, you may inspect your coins during the reunion, and if satisfied, pay me there in person by cash or check. **Remember, we only minted 100 of these special coins, and 81 of them are already spoken for, so don't delay if you want one or more!**

Air Force Photomapping Association and Coin

Also, remember that if you served in the Squadron between July 1959 and July 1972, while it was still attached to Air Force Photomapping parent units, you are also eligible to join the *Air Force Photomapping Association* and purchase the Photomapping coin. *If you are interested in joining the Association, contact Gordon Barnes*, Director of Membership, *at glbjlb@charter.net*.

If you are interested in the Photomapper coin, you may view it and the related cost and ordering information at www.1370th.org/coin.html. These coins are currently sold out, and it requires a minimum order of 50 to put them back into production at the Mint. So far, Gordon has received orders for only 10-12 coins, so right now, it's not looking too promising for another reorder. If you really are interested in ordering a Photomapper coin, please contact Gordon Barnes at glbjlb@charter.net and tell him how many coins you want and your shipping address.
